Greetings

Considering the global "water problems" and the fact that they will continue and become more serious in the future, the engagement of "young people" (youth) who will lead the next generation is essential in solving the problems. In this basic recognition, various youth activities and organizations are being developed worldwide. Taking the opportunity of the 4th Asia-Pacific Water Summit, a major water-related event to be held in Kyushu, Japan, we believe that we should promote the establishment and enhancement of such activities by young people in Japan. And so we launched <Youth Water Forum Kyushu>, as an arena for deepening the involvement of high school generation in water issues and promoting international exchange and global communication.



We then asked the high school generation to make videos about water for the summit, and through the planning, production, and presentation of their videos, learn and exchange opinions on water issues in the region and around the world and efforts to address them.

With the support and cooperation of many, thirty high schools and groups had submitted videos by the summit. Many who attended the summit, including leaders from the Asia-Pacific region, were able to view the videos and learn about our activities. The videos were also screened at the 9th World Water Forum held in Senegal in March 2022 and other such efforts have been made to disseminate information and promote exchange.

Based on these activities, we will expand the scope of the <Youth Water Forum> and further develop international exchanges. We look forward to the participation of many young people of high school students age and the continued support and cooperation of everyone involved.





Purpose and Prospects of Youth Water Forum Kyushu

Water is both a global issue and a local one, affecting every area of Japan. If we are to resolve water challenges, cross-generational efforts are needed.

Therefore, we have launched a platform for the youth: "Youth Water Forum", in order to involve the young people of high-school age. A sustainable future depends on how the younger generation deals with water issues.

There are numerous water-related problems associated with climate change, such as droughts or heavy rain and snow.

These events are worsening. Water is an overarching theme of the UN's SDGs and is also related to the history of the region. Cross-generational efforts are needed if we are to resolve water-related problems. This is why we are inviting those of high-school age to create and submit videos related to water.

Last year, we invited applications for "water-themed videos" produced by the high school generation themselves. We received 30 submissions from all over Japan, and we sent out our youth activities to the world on the official website of Youth Water Forum Kyushu, our YouTube channel, and other social networking services. This year, we not

only call for videos but we will share your activities with the world at the UN Water Conference in New York City in March 2023.




