- As the initiative grew, so did the need to expand its scope and impact. In 2024, Youth with Sanitation Concern (YSC) evolved into Yayasan Sagara Cita Indonesia, known as YSC Indonesia. This transformation broadened the foundation's mission and intensified its focus on clean water, proper sanitation, and climate change resilience. We believe an integrated approach is essential to create a wider and more sustainable impact. Additionally, we must address the challenges posed by climate change, which are increasingly affecting communities, particularly in the health and sustainability of water resources.
- The name "Sagara Cita" emphasizes the foundation's commitment to water (Sagara = ocean) and its mission to sustain natural resources and water ecosystems in Indonesia.

#### YOUTH'S ROLE IN CHANGE

Youth remains a central focus in every initiative of the YSC Indonesia. We believe that by providing them with space and opportunities to work and actively participate, they can create significant change. The foundation is dedicated to empowering future leaders by involving young people as key actors in the global movement for change.



# Support Sustainability Project Millenials Fight Covid-19

The Millennials Fight Covid-19 Project for MCK rehabilitation began in 2020 and is now in its fifth year. YSC Indonesia is evaluating the effectiveness of technology and community-based organizations (CBOs) in toilet maintenance.

#### **RESULT:**

- 15 (Fifteen) households contributed to buying a water pump and agreed to raise the MCK management fee from 3000 to 5000 per month
- The solar panels are in good condition and should last another five years

- 75 people have access to safe sanitation facilities and clean water.
- The budget for managing public toilets has increased.
- Public Toilet was desludge in Dec 2024 (last done in 2020 and 2022)

YSC Indonesia has build a septic tank above the sea using Tripikon S and H technology by the end of 2023. In 2024, we tested the quality of wastewater and community water to evaluate the effectiveness of the Tripikon H septic tank in coastal areas.

#### **RESULT:**

High salinity influential to effectiveness technology tripicon H

Need existence research advanced For lower salinity in the water source so that maximize function technology tripicon H



## Waste Friendly School

YSC Indonesia has signed a one-year memorandum of understanding with Sekolah Islam Azzahra to support the Waste Friendly School program. We found that this school produces 128.89kg of waste per day, of which 40% is organic waste, and 30% is low value waste.

This initiative aims to change the behavior of school residents regarding waste management, with the goal of reducing waste in schools by 35% each year.

#### **RESULT:**

- Schools are implementing waste sorting regulations
- Schools developing a curriculum for waste behavior change to integrate into the education system by 2025.

- One (1) school integrated to waste management
- 1,285 students participated in waste management in school



### YSC X SATO LIXIL

#### **Public Toilet Rehabilitation**

YSC is partnering with Sato LIXIL to renovate public toilets in the RT.046 Pesawahan villages of Bandar Lampung. The project will feature water-saving "SATO" toilets and biofilter septic tanks, along with solar-powered pumps and brackish water filters to improve water access.

This collaboration also aims to introduce "SATO" technology in Lampung, addressing the need for water-saving toilets in coastal and water-scarce areas.

#### **RESULT:**

Community contribution of IDR 20,700,000 (for labor and food)

- One (1) rehabilitated public toilet
- 90 people have access to sanitation facilities
- 1 Community Based Organization (CBO) established to maintain public toilet facilities

### World Toilet Day 2024



World Toilet Day 2024 presents a vital opportunity for YSC Indonesia to raise awareness about the sanitation crisis, especially among young people. The key activities include:

#### 1. Field Study at Bakung Waste Water Treatment Plant, Bandar Lampung

• In collaboration with Malahayati University, attended by 87 students

#### 2. Reels and Poster Competition

- Themes: "Clean Toilet" and "Toilet and Water Pollutants"
- Partners: Trash Ranger, The Mulungs, Mudak Asyik
- Participated in by 17 young people from various regions of Indonesia

#### 3. Public Campaign at "Music Riverside" Event

- Introduced sanitation through music, art installations made from trash, and drama along the Way Belau River. Local youth became the main drivers of the activity in collaboration with youth from the university. Attendees had a chance to win a free septic tank desludging
- Drawn in 657 attendees
- This initiative involved seven partners: Way Seputih Foundation, Azzahra Islamic Schools, PD Kebersihan (Regional Wastewater Plant), House & Settlement Office, Malahayati University, Lampung University, and PT Gula Madu

- Desludging the toilet
- 175 people have access to safe sanitation
- A total 1,640 people educated about safe sanitation
- A total of 27,323 Instagram accounts exposed to sanitation information
- 11 news published in mass media
