# **Asia-Pacific Regional Process**







The Asia-Pacific Regional Process is divided into five sub-regions:

- Northeast Asia,
- Southeast Asia,
- South Asia,
- Central Asia & the Caucasus, and
- Pacific Islands.

To ensure cohesive multi-stakeholder discussions, the Asia-Pacific Regional Process first established a 10-topic framework aligned with the six sub-themes and topics of the thematic process.

Each sub-region then selected the topics, and prioritized and has discussed specific issues, presents breakthroughs, and shares best practices to address challenges and enhance effective water management practices tailored to local and cultural contexts.
